**SUBJECT: FINAL READING: PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF BOARD POLICY,
5120, STUDENT SCHOOL ASSIGNMENT AND ATTENDANCE
BOUNDARY COMMITTEE**

The School Board of Miami-Dade County Florida, announced on April 17, 2024, its intent to amend Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee*, at its meeting on June 18, 2024.

The Attendance Boundary Committee is recommending the following:

- Reconfigure Myrtle Grove K-8 to Myrtle Grove Elementary School for the 2024-2025 school year. No boundary changes.
- Establish new boundaries for Calusa Elementary, Claude Pepper Elementary, Crestview Elementary, Eneida M. Hartner Elementary, North Twin Lakes Elementary, Scott Lake Elementary, Shadowlawn Elementary, Toussaint L'Ouverture Elementary, and Twin Lakes Elementary schools for the 2024-2025 school year.

The Notice of Intended Action was published in the *Miami Daily Business Review* on April 23, 2024, posted in various places for the public information and mailed to various organizations representing persons affected by the amended policy and to individuals requesting notification.

The time to request a hearing or protest the adoption has elapsed.

In accordance with provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act, this amended policy is presented to The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, for adoption and authorization to file the policy in the official records of the School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida.

Attached is the Notice of Intended Action and the policy proposed for amendment. Changes from the current policy are indicated by underscoring the words to be added and ~~striking through~~ words to be deleted.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, adopt amended School Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee* and the documents, *Attendance Zones Previously Approved 2023-2024*, *Attendance Zone Recommendations and Related Administrative Actions 2024-2025*, which is incorporated by reference and is part of this policy, and authorize the Superintendent to file the policy with the School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, to be effective July 1, 2024.

NOTICE OF INTENDED ACTION

THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY, FLORIDA, announced on April 17, 2024, its intention to amend Board Policy 5120, *Student School Assignment and Attendance Boundary Committee*, at its meeting on June 18, 2024.

PURPOSE AND EFFECT: To establish attendance zones for elementary and secondary schools for the 2024-2025 school year which are in the best interest of students and better utilize existing student stations.

SUMMARY: Board approval of this policy would support previously approved attendance boundary zones and establish all Board-approved attendance zones as a Board policy.

SPECIFIC LEGAL AUTHORITY UNDER WHICH RULEMAKING IS AUTHORIZED: 1001.41(1) (2); 1001.42(10); F.S.

LAW IMPLEMENTED, INTERPRETED, OR MADE SPECIFIC: 1000.05; 1001.42(4), (10); 1001.49(3); 1003.06, F.S.

IF REQUESTED, A HEARING WILL BE HELD DURING THE BOARD MEETING on June 18, 2024, which begins at 1:00 p.m., in the School Board Administration Building, School Board Auditorium, 1450 N. E. Second Avenue, Miami, Florida 33132, or through a teleconferencing technology alternative. Persons requesting such a hearing or who wish to provide information regarding the statement of estimated regulatory costs, or to provide a proposal for a lower cost regulatory alternative as provided by Section 120.541(1), F.S., must do so in writing by May 15, 2024, to the Superintendent of Schools, Room 912, at the same address.

ANY PERSON WHO DECIDES TO APPEAL THE DECISION made by The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, with respect to this action will need to ensure the preparation of a verbatim record of the proceedings including the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based. 5120 - STUDENT SCHOOL ASSIGNMENT AND ATTENDANCE BOUNDARY COMMITTEE

The assignment of students to District schools shall be consistent with the best interests of students and the best use of District resources.

Attendance Areas ~~2023-2024~~2024-2025

The Superintendent is responsible for proposing attendance areas for District schools. The Superintendent will be assisted in this task by ~~School Operations~~, the Office of School Leadership and Performance, the Office of School Facilities, and the Attendance Boundary Committee (ABC).

The Offices of School Facilities and ~~School Operations~~ School Leadership and Performance will provide the Attendance Boundary Committee and the community with proposed attendance boundary changes for schools in 2024-2025~~2023-2024~~. Community input on these boundary changes will be solicited at regional community meetings. Individuals who wish to present alternate recommendations will be assisted by region staff. Any alternate proposals must be reviewed through the same process as the Superintendent's proposals. Community and ABC meetings will be held to present the attendance boundaries established for 2024-2025~~2023-2024~~. The Superintendent is authorized to develop administrative procedures to implement this process.

The ABC will take the following factors into consideration when reviewing proposed attendance areas regarding school boundaries: declining enrollment and ability to conduct a viable educational program, compliance with class size reduction mandate, impact on special education programs, use of available student stations within contiguous areas, degree and extent of transportation, programmatic impact due to lack of student housing, reduction of the number of schools students must attend, integrity of feeder systems, assignment of students from new residential developments to specific schools prior to completion of developments, construction of new schools, impact of changes to other school boundaries, promotion and maintenance of diverse school enrollments, and prevention, reduction or elimination of racial isolation to the extent practicable.

Staff ~~in School Operations~~ in the Office of School Leadership and Performance, Office of School Facilities, Information Technology Services, Department of Transportation, Research Services, Office of Diversity Compliance, and Office of Intergovernmental Affairs, Grants Administration and Community Engagement, will

assist the Superintendent in providing data, analyze proposed attendance areas, and prepare recommendations for submission to the School Board.

The Board-approved school attendance zones for the current school year are contained in the following documents:

Copies of these documents are incorporated by reference in this policy and are on file in the Office of Board Recording Secretary and in the Citizen Information Center.

No assignment to schools or attendance schedules shall discriminate against students on the basis of gender, race, religion, disability, national origin, sex, color, ethnic or national origin, marital status, genetic information, age, political beliefs, sexual orientation, gender identification, social and family background, linguistic preference, medical reason, pregnancy, childbirth, medical condition to pregnancy, handicap, handicap against a student or employee, and any other legally prohibited basis.

The parent of siblings who are assigned to the same grade level and school may request that the school place the siblings in the same classroom or in separate classrooms. This request must be made no later than five (5) days before the first day of school each school year or five (5) days after the first day of attendance of the students if the students are enrolled in school after the school year commences. The school is not required to meet the request if there is factual evidence indicating a specific placement is better for the student than that requested by the parent.

The Superintendent may assign a student to a school other than that designated by the attendance area when such exception is justified by circumstances and is in the best interest of the student.

Whenever school boundaries are revised, every effort shall be made to continue a student in the elementary school to which s/he was initially assigned.

Wherever possible and advisable in the interests of students in non-magnet schools and programs, siblings shall be assigned to the same school. Assignment of siblings of students to magnet schools and programs is governed by Policy 2370.

The Superintendent shall assign incoming transfer students to schools, grades, and classes that provide each student the greatest likelihood of realizing their fullest educational potential.

The principal shall assign students in his/her school to appropriate grades, classes, or groups. This action shall be based on consideration of the needs of the student as well as the administration of the school.

Request for Student Transfers

A student may be permitted to attend a school other than the school serving the parents' residential area as stipulated in Policy 5131.

Nonresident Students

Students who are not residents of Miami-Dade County may attend District schools as stipulated in Policy 5131.

SUBJECT: EXPULSION AND ASSIGNMENT OF STUDENTS TO ALTERNATIVE SCHOOL PROGRAM

COMMITTEE: PERSONNEL, STUDENT, SCHOOL, AND COMMUNITY SUPPORT

PLAN: SAFE, HEALTHY, AND SUPPORTIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT

The Superintendent of Schools can recommend that students be expelled from the regular, specialized centers, and adult programs of Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) and assigned to an alternative school/program for the remainder of the school year and one (1) additional year of attendance pursuant to Florida Statutes, Sections 1003.01(10) and 1006.13(3).

Additionally, pursuant to Florida Statutes, Section 1006.13(3), the Superintendent may, on a case-by-case basis, request that the School Board modify the expulsion requirement when it is in the best interest of the student and the school system. In these instances, the Superintendent can recommend that students receive a modified assignment of less than the maximum permitted by Florida Statutes Section 1003.01(10) with a work-back option.

Under School Board Policy 5610 – *Suspension and Expulsion of Students*, parents/guardians have been duly notified of the recommendation for expulsion, were given an opportunity for a conference with staff, and were advised of the right to a hearing before an impartial hearing examiner.

Additional information regarding these students has been forwarded to the Board under separate cover.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida:

1. expel the students specified in supplemental material SM-99 (Grade 7) and SM-110 (Grade 8) furnished under separate cover to School Board members from the regular, specialized centers and adult programs of Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Expulsion assignments to an alternative school/program will be for the maximum time permitted under law, which is the 2023-2024 school year, the 2024 summer session, and the 2024-2025 school year.
2. modify the expulsion for the students specified in supplemental material SM-113 (Grade 3) and SM-106 (Grade 5) furnished under separate cover to School Board members from the regular, specialized centers and adult programs of Miami-Dade County Public Schools and assigned to an alternative school/program for less than the maximum time permitted under law, which is the 2023-2024 school year, the 2024 summer session, and the 2024-2025 school year.
3. provide continuing educational services in an alternative school/program during the term of the expulsion.
