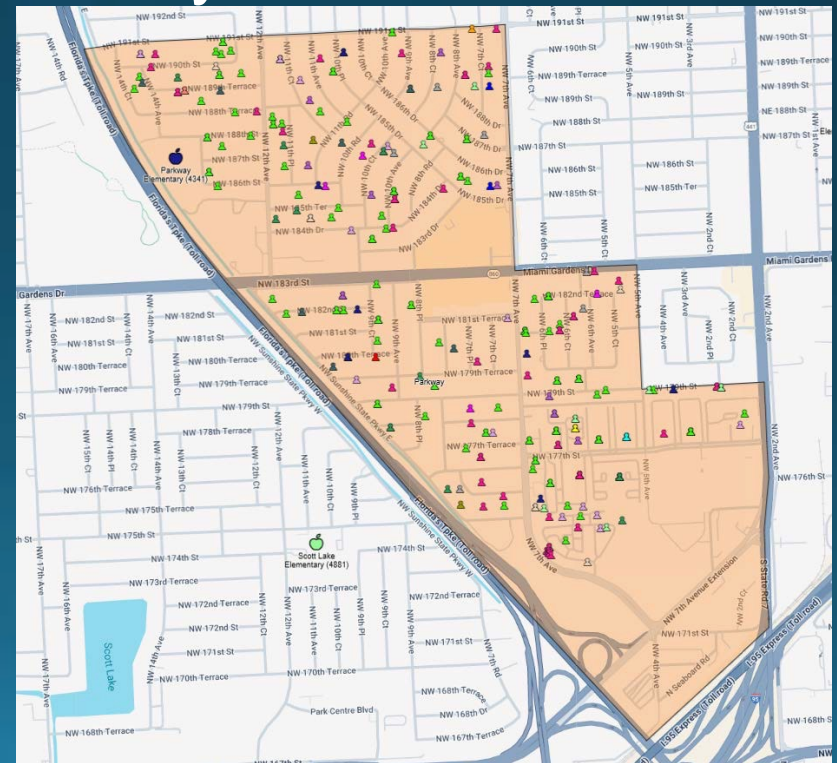

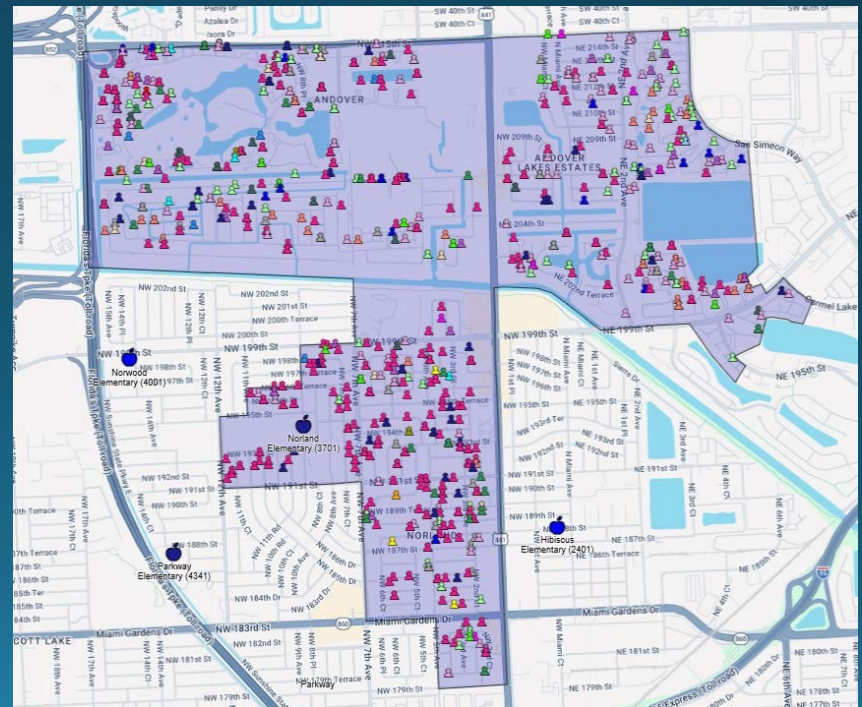

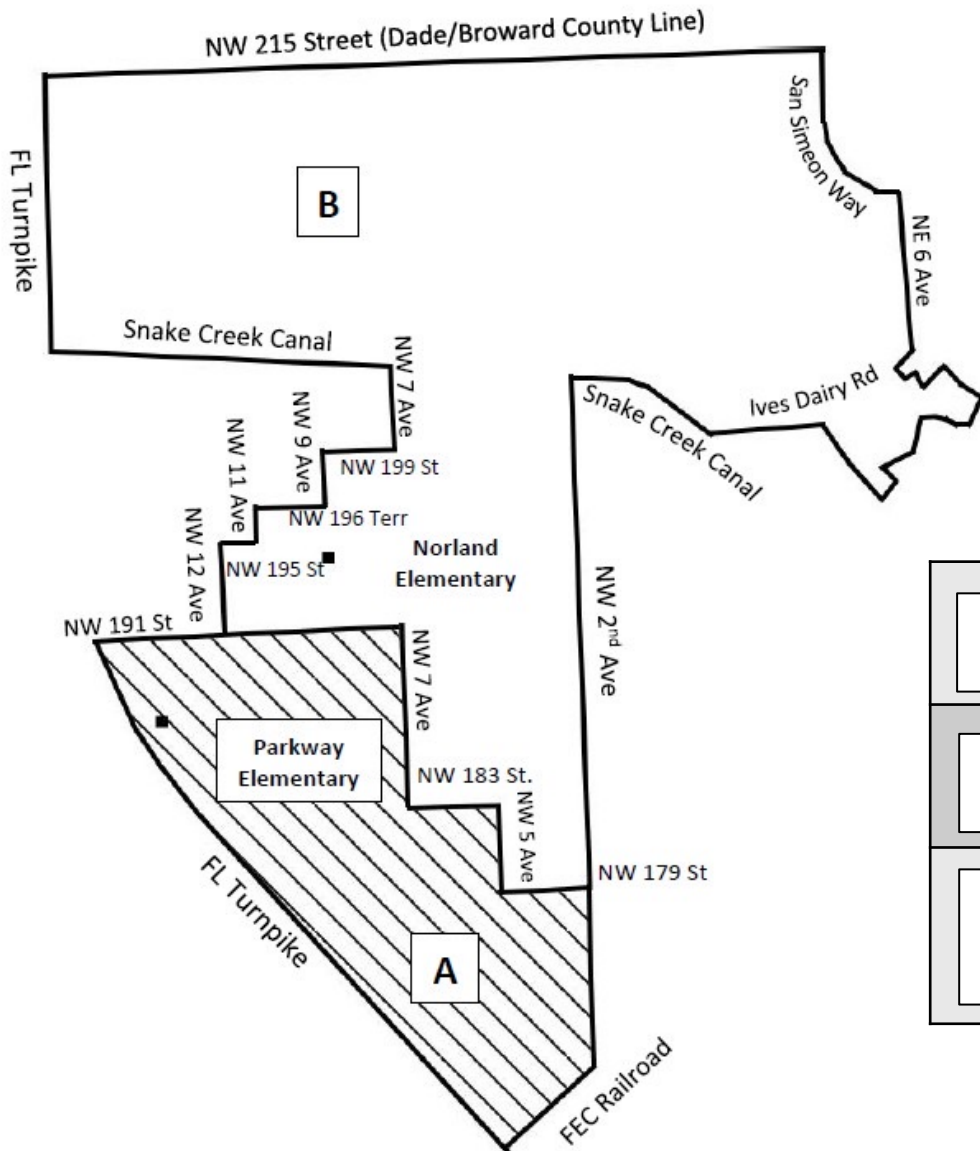

Effects

Beginning with the 2026-2027 School Year:

- New boundaries will be established for Norland Elementary School to include the Parkway Elementary School boundary (Area A).
- Norland Elementary will be the new boundary elementary school for students in K-5 residing in area A.
- Approximately 106 rising 1st through 5th grade students, currently attending Parkway Elementary and residing in Area A, may attend Norland Elementary School.
- Nine rising 1st through 5th grade students attending Parkway Elementary residing outside of the school boundary will have the option to attend Norland Elementary School.
- Norland Elementary will have new boundaries.
- Middle School boundaries will remain the same.
- High School boundaries will remain the same.

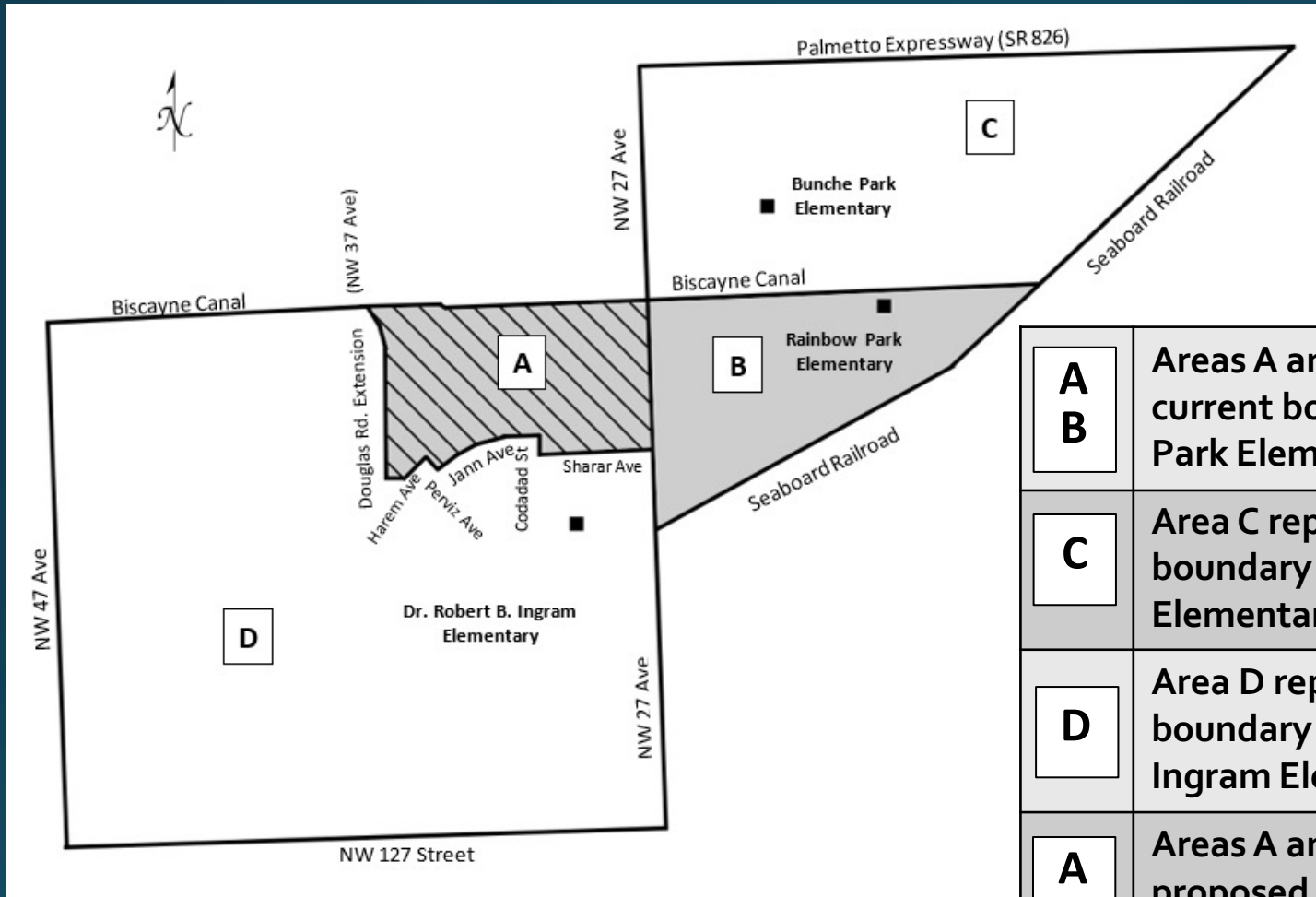

Due to declining enrollment and the ability to conduct a viable educational program the following recommendations are proposed.

- Dissolve the current boundary for Rainbow Park Elementary School.
- Divide the Rainbow Park Elementary School boundary between Bunche Park Elementary and Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary using NW 27 Avenue as the dividing line.
- Establish new boundaries for Bunche Park and Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary Schools.

Beginning with the 2026-2027 School Year:

- New boundaries will be established for Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary School to include the West portion of Rainbow Park Elementary School boundary (Area A).
- Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary School will be the new boundary elementary school for students in K – 5 residing in Area A.
- Approximately 28 rising 1st through 5th grade students, currently attending Rainbow Park Elementary and residing in Area A, may attend Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary School.
- The Dance Magnet program will move to Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary School – Approximately 18 rising 1st through 5th grade students participating in the Dance Magnet, (11 from inside the Rainbow Park Boundary and 7 from outside the boundary), will continue in the program. Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary has a larger capacity, providing an opportunity for the Dance Magnet program to grow.

Effects

Beginning with the 2026-2027 School Year:

- New boundaries will be established for Bunche Park Elementary School to include the East portion of Rainbow Park Elementary School boundary (Area B).
- Bunche Park Elementary School will be the new boundary elementary school for students in K – 5 residing in Area B.
- Approximately 63 rising 1st through 5th grade students, currently attending Rainbow Park Elementary and residing in Area B, may attend Bunche Park Elementary School.
- Sixteen rising 1st through 5th grade students attending Rainbow Park Elementary but residing outside of the school boundary will have the choice option to attend Bunche Park Elementary, Dr. Robert B. Ingram Elementary.
- Middle School and High School boundaries will remain the same.

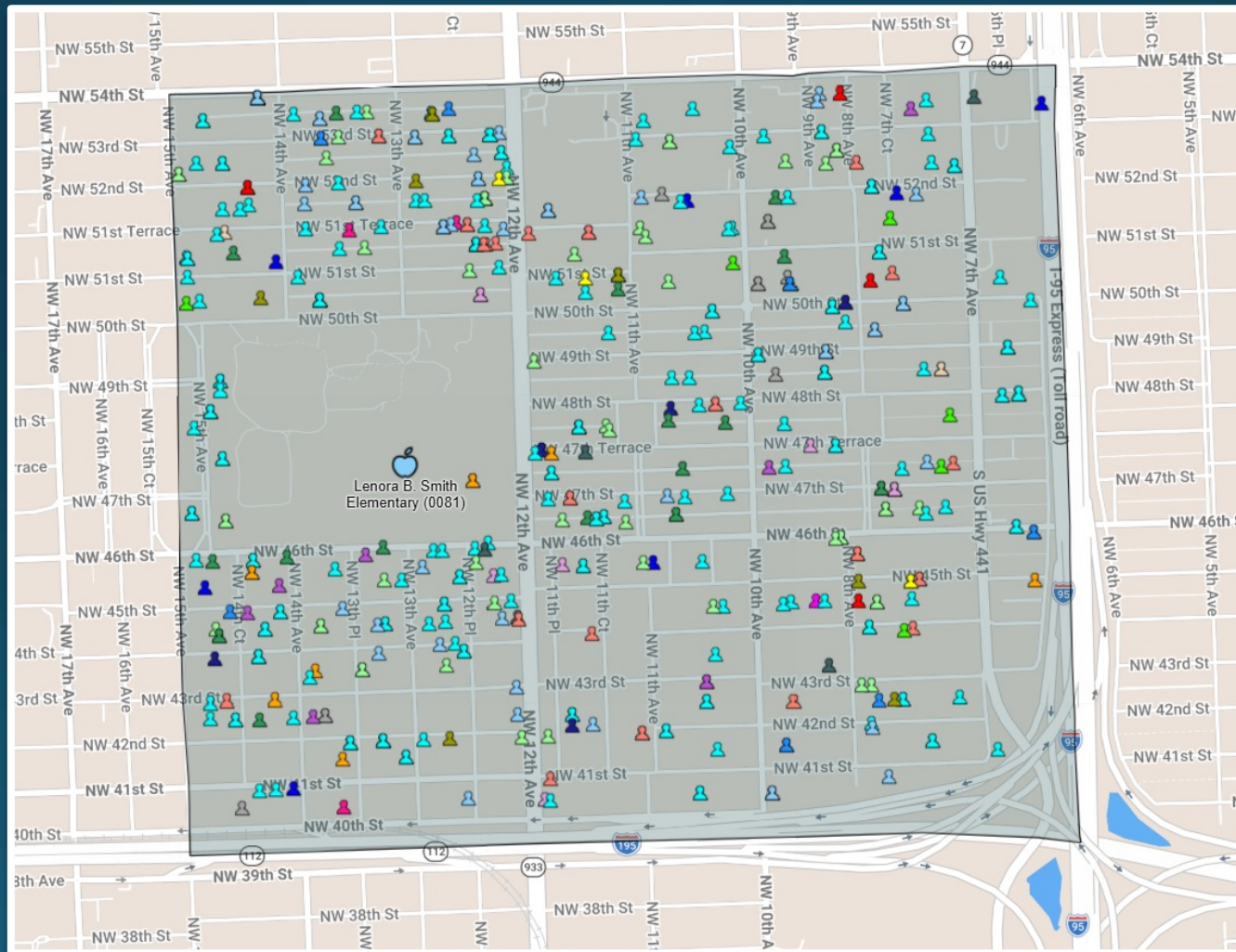

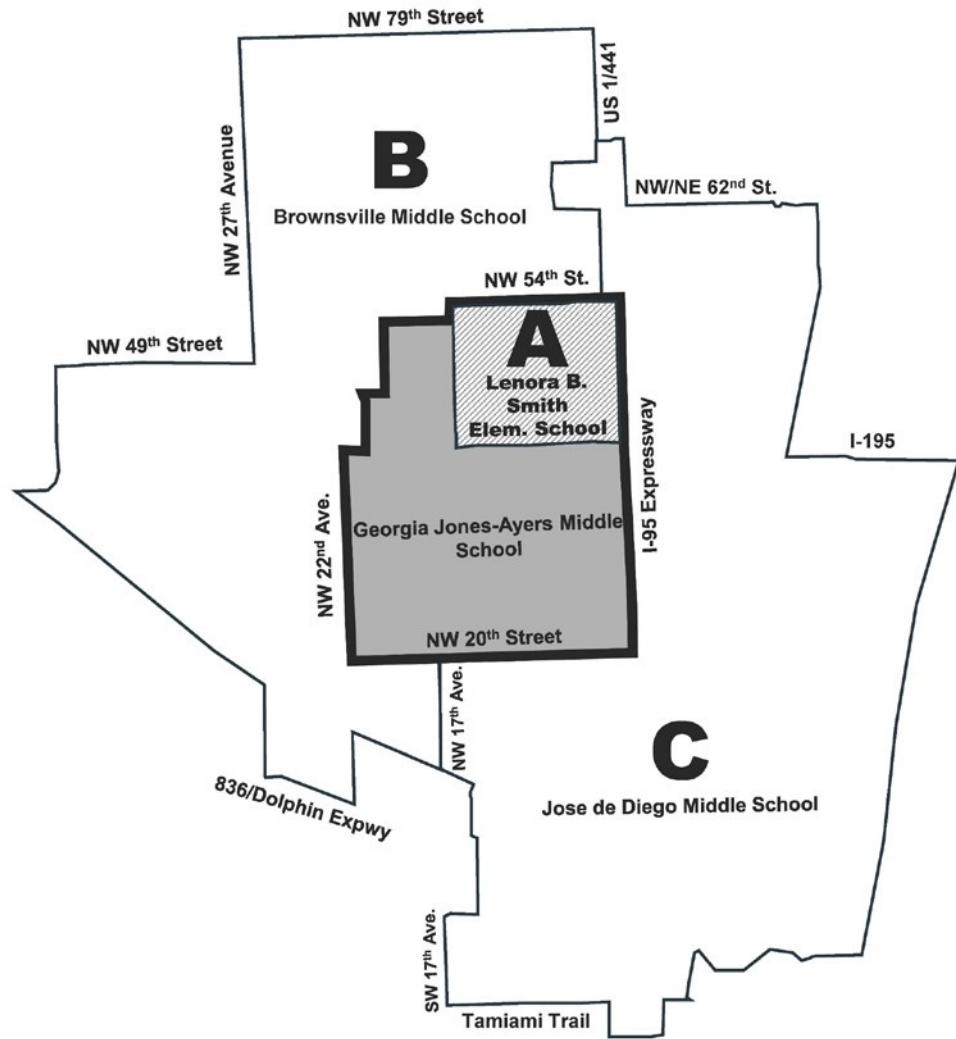
Impact

- All middle grade students (6th – 8th) residing in the George Jones-Ayers/Lenora B. Smith K-8 boundary will have the option to attend George Jones-Ayers/Lenora B. Smith K-8 for grades 6th – 8th or may attend the boundary residence middle school.
- Preserve both names, Georgia Jones-Ayers & Lenora B. Smith, as a combined name, Georgia Jones-Ayers/Lenora B. Smith K-8 Center, as recommended from community feedback.
