Matthew A. Pigatt is an educator, author, community leader, and public servant whose career has focused on advancing education, civic engagement, and community empowerment. A South Florida native, he graduated magna cum laude from Morehouse College with a Bachelor of Arts in African American Studies and Psychology. During his undergraduate years, Pigatt secured more than \$100,000 in scholarships, fellowships, and paid academic and professional opportunities. His research took him to academic programs at Morehouse College, the University of California, Berkeley, and Emory University, as well as international study experiences in Paris, France, and Dar es Salaam, Tanzania. His research examined the academic success of high-achieving Black men, contributing to broader conversations about educational equity and student achievement.

Following graduation, Pigatt returned to South Florida, where he devoted himself to community organizing and youth development. He became actively involved with People Acting for Community Together (PACT), serving on its Juvenile Justice Committee and advocating for reforms that helped reduce out-of-school suspensions in Miami-Dade County Public Schools. He also assumed leadership roles within the 100 Black Men of South Florida Leadership Academy, mentoring young people and supporting educational initiatives. During this period, he founded the South Florida HBCU Picnic, which grew into one of the region's largest celebrations of Historically Black Colleges and Universities, and established the Sankofa Cypher, an organization dedicated to promoting African and African American history, culture, and intellectual engagement.
