To provide information regarding training for administration of the Florida Standards Alternate Assessment (FSAA)-Performance Task.

- The FSAA-Performance Task will be administered to students on a modified curriculum in the following subjects and grade levels:
 - English/Language Arts 1 and 2 for students in 3rd through 10th grades (Access course)
 - Mathematics for students in 3rd through 8th grades (Access course)
 - Writing for students in 4th through 10th grades (Access course)
 - Science for students in 5th and 8th grades (Access course)
 - Middle School End-of-Course for students enrolled in the Access Civics course
 - High School End-of-Courses for students enrolled in Access Algebra I, Access Geometry, Access Biology I and U.S. History course(s)
- The FSAA-Performance Task is administered to each student individually by the student's teacher, a certified teacher, or other licensed professional who has worked extensively with the student and who is trained in the assessment procedures. It is designed to demonstrate student mastery of the Florida Standards Access Points.
- Teachers of students who will participate in the FSAA-Performance Task who have not received training are required to attend a one-day, virtual FSAA Administration Training session that will be held on the following dates:
 - Wednesday, February 2, 2022, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
 - Wednesday, February 9, 2022, from 8:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m.
 - Wednesday, February 16, 2022, from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.
- Participants must register for one session through the Frontline Professional Development Management System, under activity title "District Led Training for the Florida Standards Alternate Assessment (FSAA) – Performance Task". Participants will earn seven (7) Master Plan Points (MPP) for their completion of the training. The Zoom link will be sent to each registered participant prior to the session.
- Teachers who have previously completed the FSAA Administration Training must recertify by completing four online training modules that will be available beginning on Monday, January 10, 2022, at <https://fsaa.fsassessments.org/performance-task-teachers.html>.
- The Florida Department of Education will provide a monthly report to the Department of Exceptional Student Education (ESE) identifying teachers who have completed the four online training modules required for recertification. **Teachers who have not completed the required trainings will not be permitted to administer the assessment.**
