Florida International University, School of Education, has been awarded a grant, in the amount of \$647,920, from the United States Department of Education to implement GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awareness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) EXPRESS in the Miami Central Senior High School Feeder Pattern. GEAR UP EXPRESS will provide a diverse range of early intervention services to support a cohort of students in their future pursuit of post-secondary studies. The services include extended learning time after school, tutoring, mentoring, counseling, career exposure, professional development in math and reading, parent involvement activities, increased access to technology in school media centers and social services. Funding, while anticipated for five years, will depend upon Congressional appropriations.

Authorization is being requested to enter into a contractual agreement with Florida International University, in the amount of \$121,380, to support activities as required by the GEAR UP EXPRESS grant. The target populations are the sixth grade students at Madison and Westview Middle Schools. Each middle school will receive \$60,690, to cover the cost of activities including tutoring/extended learning time, increased access to technology and media center for students and families, professional development for teachers in mathematics, science and reading, parent activities, data collection and a staff liaison.

Miami-Dade County Public Schools has made a matching commitment to GEAR UP EXPRESS implementation with the following in-kind services: technology-related networking at Miami Central Senior High School; costs for transportation; food services; teachers for a summer program based on a university campus; teacher trainers; extra period supplements in mathematics; and substitutes to release teachers for professional development.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. enter into a contractual agreement with Florida International University to receive funds, in the amount of \$121,380, to implement Early Intervention and Academic Improvement Services at Madison and Westview Middle Schools, October 1, 1999 August 31, 2000; and
- 2. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
