SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT A GRANT AWARD FROM THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION FOR FUNDING THE BUILDING THE DIGITAL VILLAGE: LEAVING NO CHILD BEHIND PROJECT; PROJECT CYCLE: JULY 6, 2001 THROUGH JULY 31, 2002.

The Division of Instructional Technology and Media Support Services has received a Florida Department of Education Technology Literacy Challenge Fund award in the local impact category for a project entitled Building the Digital Village: Leaving No Child Behind.

The project helps to create technologically literate families and prepares them to participate in the learning process of their children. The mission of the grant is to populate the digital village with a community of teachers, parents, and students, all using electronic communication tools ensuring that no child is left behind to fail.

Grant funds in the amount of \$744,118 will cover project personnel, travel, professional and technical services, equipment, software, printing, and duplicating.

The grant program includes the following schools: Edison Park Elementary, Little River Elementary, Miami Shores Elementary, Phyllis Ruth Miller Elementary, Morningside Elementary, Shadowlawn Elementary, and Toussaint L'Ouverture.

Preliminary notification of this grant award was received from the Florida Commissioner of Education on August 20, 2001, which is after the effective start date of this grant. The grant award allows for the reimbursement of expenditures from July 6, 2001.

No local funds are required.

RECOMMENDED: That The School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida, authorize the Superintendent to:

- 1. accept a grant award from the Florida Department of Education, in the amount of \$744,118, for funding the Building the Digital Village: Leaving No Child Behind Project; Project Cycle: July 6, 2001 through July 31, 2002;
- extend this grant award, at no additional cost, for up to one year, as authorized through official notification from the granting agency, if deemed necessary, in order to fully expend the grant award and thus complete the scope of the project; and
- 3. Financial Affairs to establish appropriations in the amounts approved by the granting agency; such appropriations to be reported periodically to the Board.
